

WELCOME

NJUG and its members are committed to excellence in the delivery of street works

Utility companies are major contributors to economic growth, investing billions of pounds each year through network investment to ensure safe, reliable and essential utility services, which underpin the UK and local economy. A very high proportion of these services are under the street – invisible, taken for granted, but essential to all.

The Armitt Review, an independent analysis on behalf of the Labour Party in regards to long term infrastructure planning, indicates that there will be 73 million people in the UK by 2035; DfT's Road Transport Forecast 2013 predicts a 43% increase in traffic between 2010 and 2040; and massive housing and infrastructure programmes are needed. This requires continued investment on an increasing scale in the nation's utility networks to support the needs of an increased population, at the levels of security and reliability we currently enjoy.

Add the impact of these factors together, alongside little increase in local road capacity, and it is absolutely clear that we have to deliver a step change in minimising road occupation - through innovation and working with highway authority colleagues and through enhanced co-ordination of major road and street works programmes.

In order to meet this challenge, the NJUG Vision for Street Works has been updated to sharpen its focus on innovative ways of working, new technologies, materials and equipment, and to emphasise the need for all those planning and delivering essential street works to continue to drive up standards and further reduce disruption.

The NJUG Vision for Street Works requires working together with local authorities, utilities and contractors to make it a reality, which will become more important as competing pressures on our roads increase.

I look forward to working together with you all in meeting this challenge.

NJUG Ltd. is the UK industry association representing utilities and their contractors solely on street works issues. We are the utilities arm of the Highway Authority and Utilities Committee representing the street and road works sector in England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales that is known as HAUC(UK). Utilities undertake street works for four main reasons – safety, security of supply, to connect new customers / enhance existing customers' supplies, or to divert apparatus to facilitate major urban regeneration or transport infrastructure projects.

Safety

Having a competent, caring and responsible work force whilst carrying out street works to ensure sites are kept to a high standard, through compliance with the 'Safety at Street Works and Road Works' Code of Practice and working with other road users to minimise road occupation where safe and practical to do so.

High Quality

Continuously focusing on improvement and high quality, and the achievement of 'right first time' in all aspects of carrying out street works.

Minimise Disruption

Working with local authorities to minimise disruption through effective planning, co-ordination and delivery of works, including traffic management utilised for the right duration to avoid unnecessary occupation.

Keep the Public Fully Informed

Communicating effectively on all aspects of street works before they take place and whilst in progress, where they impact on the public and local business.

Sustainable Methods and Materials

Taking all practical steps to maximise the use of sustainable methods and materials and minimising the impact on the environment.

Avoid Damage to Underground Assets

Taking all reasonable steps to ensure damage to underground assets is avoided.
